Review: Last week we talked about why it's tough to talk to religious people

They Make Three Dangerous Assumptions (Review)

1. They assume **they are right** all the time
2. They assume **they hear from God** all the time
3. They assume **their view of the Bible is the only view**

They Ignore Five Important Signs (Review)

1. **Lifestyle** Signs (They are **inconsistent**)
2. **Traditional** Signs (They only know **one way** to live)
3. **Pride** Signs (They **do not know how** to be wrong)
4. **Vision** Signs (They **cannot see** beyond themselves)
5. **Attitude** Signs (They do not have the **attitude** of a servant)

Four Concerns About Religious Leaders

1. They Can Become Negative Examples (Matthew 23:13-15)

- “Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! **You shut the door of the kingdom of heaven in people's faces.** You yourselves do not enter, nor will you let those enter who are trying to. 15 “Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You travel over land and sea to win a single convert, and when you have succeeded, you make them twice as much a child of hell as you are.

Question: Why are some leaders negative examples?

Answer: They are overtaken by faults (Galatians 6:1)

- Brothers and sisters, if someone is **caught in a sin**, you who live by the Spirit should restore that person gently.

2. They Can Have the Wrong Priorities (They put gold above the temple)

- 16 “Woe to you, blind guides! You say, ‘If anyone swears by the temple, it means nothing; but anyone who swears by the gold of the temple is bound by that oath.’ 17 You blind fools! **Which is greater: the gold, or the temple that makes the gold sacred?** 18 You also say, ‘If anyone swears by the altar, it means nothing; but anyone who swears by the gift on the altar is bound by that oath.’ 19 You blind men! Which is greater: the gift, or the altar that makes the gift sacred? 20 Therefore, anyone who swears by the altar swears by it and by everything on it. 21 And anyone who swears by the temple swears by it and by the one who dwells in it. 22 And anyone who swears by heaven swears by God’s throne and by the one who sits on it.



Question: Why do some leaders have the wrong priorities?

Answer: They make the wrong investments

Note: They either love money too much or do not respect it enough

3. They Can Become Petty (They Strain out a gnat and swallow a camel)

- 23 “Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You give a tenth of your spices—mint, dill and cumin. But **you have neglected the more important matters of the law**—justice, mercy and faithfulness. You should have practiced the latter, without neglecting the former. 24 You blind guides! You strain out a gnat but swallow a camel.

Question: Why are some leaders tempted to be petty?

Answer: Oftentimes they felt they were being helpful?

4. They Can Become Inwardly Corrupt: (They are often blinded by what they see)

- 25 “Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! **You clean the outside of the cup and dish**, but inside they are full of greed and self-indulgence. 26 Blind Pharisee! First clean the inside of the cup and dish, and then the outside also will be clean. 27 “Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! **You are like whitewashed tombs**, which look beautiful on the outside but on the inside are full of the bones of the dead and everything unclean. 28 In the same way, **on the outside you appear to people as righteous but** on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness. 29 “Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! **You build tombs for the prophets and decorate the graves of the righteous.** 30 And you say, ‘**If we had lived in the days of our ancestors, we would not have** taken part with them in shedding the blood of the prophets.’ 31 **So you testify against yourselves that you are the descendants of those who murdered the prophets.** 32 Go ahead, then, and complete what your ancestors started! 33 “**You snakes! You brood of vipers! How will you escape being condemned to hell?** 34 Therefore I am sending you prophets and sages and teachers. Some of them you will kill and crucify; others you will flog in your synagogues and pursue from town to town. 35 And **so upon you will come all the righteous blood that has been shed on earth**, from the blood of righteous Abel to the blood of Zechariah son of Berekiah, whom you murdered between the temple and the altar. 36 Truly I tell you, all this will come on this generation.

Question: How can a leader become inwardly corrupt?

Answer: They assume that only appearances matter
