I. Good Family Investment Advice From a Mother to a Son

1. Invest in Listening

• 2 **Listen**, my son! Listen, son of my womb! Listen, my son, the answer to my prayers!

2. Invest in Women Wisely (Do not give away your strength)

• 3 Do not spend your strength on women, your vigor on those who ruin kings.

3. Invest in Sobriety (Do not invest in strong drinks)

• 4 It is not for kings, Lemuel— it is not for kings to drink wine, not for rulers to crave beer, 5 lest they drink and forget what has been decreed and deprive all the oppressed of their rights. 6 Let beer be for those who are perishing, wine for those who are in anguish! 7 Let them drink and forget their poverty and remember their misery no more.

4. Invest in Justice

• 8 Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. 9 Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy

II. Five Investments My Mother Made in My Life

- 1. Time (She always had time for me all her life)
- **2.** Confidence (She told me I was amazing all the time)
- **3.** Instructions (She showed me how to do for myself)
- **4.** Fear (She made me a believer and never lied to me)
- **5.** Humility (She beat me running at 13 years old when she was 33)





Note One Mistake: She refused to talk about some things because she said, "I do not want that in your head." I think it would have helped me avoid some things. But, I do not think she knew how to talk about certain things.
