Big Question: What is your strategy for dealing with people who see the world differently?

Side Question: Are you clear that your choices could have a positive or negative effect on others. It can defile **many** people if not managed properly (v15)

Hebrews 12:14–15 (NIV): 14 Make every **effort** to live in **peace** with **everyone** and to be **holy**; without holiness no one will see the Lord. 15 See to it that no one <u>falls short</u> of the grace of God and that no <u>bitter root</u> grows up to cause trouble and <u>defile many</u>

I. Three Positive Goals

- 1. Make every effort to live in **peace** with everyone (v14)
- 2. Make every effort to be holy or set apart to God in your lifestyle (v14)
- **3.** Make every effort to not **defile** others because of the eternal consequences (v14, **without holiness** no one will the Lord)

II. Three Negative Concerns

- 1. Some may fall short of the grace of God (v15)
- 2. Some could develop a bitter root (v15)
- 3. Some could ignore this warning and defile many (v15, COVID-19 has given this a new meaning)

Note: The Message Version: Hebrews 12:14-15

14 Work at getting along with each other and with God (*or* be *holy*). Otherwise you'll never get so much as a glimpse of God.

15 Make sure **no one gets left out of God's generosity (or grace**). Keep a sharp eye out for **weeds of bitter discontent**. A thistle or two gone to seed can ruin a whole garden in no time.

III. Three Things You Should Refuse

- 1. Refuse to believe in **Triumphalism** (The view that you should conquer all those around you)
- 2. Refuse to allow a root of bitterness to grow in your heart
- 3. Refuse to deny people the right to disagree with you

• Genesis 2:19–20 (NIV): 19 Now the Lord God had formed out of the ground all the wild animals and all the birds in the sky. **He brought them to the man to see what he would name them**; and <u>whatever</u> the man called each living creature, **that** was its name. 20 So the man gave names to all the livestock, the birds in the sky and all the wild animals.
