

Building a Better Covenant (Decide Where You Stand)

Date: April 6-7, 2019

Text: Daniel 1:8

• 8 But **Daniel purposed** in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies nor with the wine which he drank; therefore he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself. (Daniel 1:8, NKJV)

Big Question: What have you promised **yourself**, and what have you promised **God**?

Covenant Defined: A contract or an agreement.

Two Covenants You Should Make

- 1. One With Yourself (Purpose in your heart what your boundaries will be, 1:8)
- 2. One With God (Purpose in your heart to honor God)
- Daniel 6:10 (NKJV): 10 Now when Daniel knew that the writing was signed, he went home. And in his upper room, with his windows open toward Jerusalem, he knelt down on his knees three times that day, and prayed and gave thanks before his God, as was his custom since early days.

I. The First Major Covenant After Adam and Eve (Protected Noah's Family) Genesis 6:18 (NIV)

18 But I will establish my covenant with you, and you will enter the ark—you and your sons and your wife and your sons' wives with you.

II. Two Observations About the Covenant God Made With Noah

- 1. The covenant was a personal covenant between God and Noah's family
- 2. The covenant was a personal covenant designed to save one family
- **7:1** Then the LORD said to Noah, "Come into the ark, you and all your household, because I have seen *that* you *are* righteous before Me in this generation.
- 7:7 So Noah, with his sons, his wife, and his sons' wives, went into the ark because of the waters of the flood.
- 7:15 And they went in unto Noah into the ark, two and two of all flesh, wherein is the breath of life. ¹⁶ And they that went in, went in male and female of all flesh, as God had commanded him: and **the LORD shut him in.** (NKJV)

Note: Everyone knew the terms of the covenant?

- 1. They had to come **inside** the ark
- 2. They had to leave all their possessions
- 3. They had to leave all their family
- 4. They had to leave all their **friends**
- 5. They had to live through an uncomfortable season for 377 days (1 year and 12 days; Gen. 8:14-20)

III. Three Final Facts About the Ark

1. How Long Was the Ark?

• "At approximately 510 feet long, it would take nearly one and a half football fields to equal the Ark's length. That's big enough that NASA could lay three space shuttles—nose to tail—on the Ark's roof!"

2. How Tall Was the Ark?

• The roof of Noah's Ark was more than 50 feet from the ground—higher than a modern four-story house. That's plenty of space for three extra-tall inner decks as the Bible describes.

3. How Much Could the Ark Carry? (Truckloads of cargo could be placed into the Ark)

• The Ark had the same storage capacity as about 450 standard semi-trailers. A standard livestock trailer holds about 250 sheep, so the Ark had the capacity to hold at least 120,000 sheep.
