I. Positive and Negative Peer Pressure In Action

- 1. James and John were being **negatively** pressured to **never strive for senior positions**
- 2. James and John were being **negatively** pressured to **never verbalize their dreams** publicly
- 3. James and John were being positively pressured to be **servant leaders** (cp. John 13:1-20)
- 4. James and John were being positively pressured to be examples to the Gentiles (John 20:25-28)

II. Three Lessons From a Pressured Moment

- 1. You should never allow your ambitions to be **defined** by people with less vision than you
- 2. You should never allow a moment of tension to **distract** you from your life's mission
- 3. You should never **forget** you are an **example** to those around you that don't know Christ

III. Four Peer Pressures We Must Confront In Our Future

- 1. Religious Peer Pressure (We will be tempted to fight all cultural changes)
- 2. Financial Peer Pressure (We will be tempted to be too timid or too aggressive)
- 3. Vocational Peer Pressure (We will be tempted to work too much for fear of being lazy)
- 4. Cultural Peer Pressure (**Humanism** will continue to pressure us to elevate man above God)
